Description

The Children, Young People and Families Grant Programme is a national grant programme managed by the Department for Children, Schools and Families (DCSF) to fund work to improve outcomes for children, young people, and families (parenting and couple relationships) in England. The programme provides strategic and innovation grants to organisations doing work of national significance that support DCSF's Every Child Matters programme and the DCSF Children's Plan. The programme is open to third sector organisations.

Reaching Communities is an England wide programme that aims to help meet the overall purpose of the Big Lottery Fund (BIG) to improve communities and the lives of people most in need. The four main outcomes of the programme are: people having better chances in life, stronger communities, improved rural and urban environments, healthier and more active people and communities. Reaching Communities is administered by the Big Lottery Fund. Awards for All is a joint Lottery grants scheme aimed at local communities.
