# CASCs: the Context

- Sports clubs have saved over £78 million in Rate Relief since the CASC scheme began in 2002
- Only 1 in 10 clubs claim Gift Aid\* meaning that grassroots sports clubs are missing out on vital funds they are entitled to claim
- Joining JustGiving for Sports Clubs takes the work of claiming Gift Aid away from the CASC so that the club can focus on rugby union and spend less time on administration

# WORKING ON THE COMMITTEE

What are your legal obligations when you agree to stand on a committee? What roles should be represented on the committee? We outline just what being a member of the committee entails and what should be in the club constitution to protect the interests of committee members and club alike.





# LEGAL STATUS

The course details the advantages and disadvantages of the various ways that a club can exist, including Association, CASC, Registered Charity and Limited Company. We focus in particular on the implications for those on the committee and how the choice of status affects the way in which the club should be managed.





# INSURANCE

Our increasingly litigious society means that there is an ever increasing likelihood of being sued if a member of your management team is negligent and causes an accident where someone is injured. It should be noted that all insurance cover places a requirement for the club officials to take 'reasonable case' but what does this actually mean in practice? We outline the types of insurance a sports club needs to have in place and which ones are legally required (particularly if the club uses volunteers, helpers and/or work experience personnel).

# Inequality

- Equality does not exist.
- Disabled people do participate at the same levels as non-disabled people.
- Not to do with fitness, social cohesion, medical issues, charitable ideals, personnel development, health etc
- Those areas not unique to disabled people.





# What is causing the inequality?

- Barriers to participation
- But what are the barriers
- Where are they?
- Who created them?





# Barriers to participation

- Access
- Transport
- Attitudes
- Cost
- Opportunities
- Promotion
- Confidence

Research concluded that without intervention the traditional forces of supply and demand were unlikely to address the needs of disabled people in the sport and physical activity environment





# Barriers

- Barriers created by perception
- Not ramps, not toilets, not equipment
- Created by providers
- Created by disabled people
- Created by society
- Cerebral rather than real





# So whose to blame?

- Everybody
- We have created a vision and an ideal of a exclusiveness
- Made it easy for the mainstream to opt out.
- Turned disability sport into a ‘good deed’
- Into a worthy cause. Not top any agenda (apart from mine)

# Sports Forum Grants 2011

- What's new ?
  - Swindon Sports Strategy
    - We will support it by asking clubs to consider how they will contribute to it
    - Not to detriment of minority sports
  - Earlier deadline
    - July 31<sup>st</sup> last date for applications



# Sports Forum Grants 2011

- Money split into 3 funds:
  - £13,000 for grants for club development (grants between £250 & £1,200)
  - £1,500 for clubs for projects to increase participation (grants between £250 & £500) especially for disadvantaged groups
  - £2,500 for individuals (Grants between £250 & £500)



# Eligibility

- Accredited Clubs (Own Sports NGB Clubmark, SBC Accreditation Level I, WASP etc).
- Clubs operating within Swindon Borough /Individuals living within Swindon Borough.
- New Projects (ie not already started)
- Max of 75% of project cost.
- Projects for under 18's favoured but not exclusive to them.
- Projects for disadvantaged, disabled favoured but not exclusive to them.



# What can the grants be used for?

- Anything to improve the standard of clubs or individuals or increase participation in the sport.
- Improvement of facilities.
- Equipment.
- Coaching / Training of Coaches.
- For Clubs non recurring costs i.e. Projects for individuals - running costs allowed.



# Eligibility 2

- Only one individual applicant per club and must be through head coach.
- Separate Club & Individual application forms.
- As introduced last year , more questions – financial status of club / parents of individuals.
- No correspondence will be entered into.
- 2008/9 Grant Clubs can re-apply but priority will be given to fresh clubs.



# Applications in by end July 2011

- E-leaflets & application forms are available now.
